Hannah, Vicky, Catherine, Jackie and myself went to York for the day. It was cold and wet but we all had a lovely time. We went shopping and got lots of new things.


We enjoyed our day very much even though it rained and rained so we all got wet. What a lovely day!


Equality and Diversity Presentation from Nathan by Nigel


Our student social worker put together a presentation all about equality and diversity for our residents. He explained what each of the terms meant and put on a demonstration of this using fun activities.

Nigel and Alan are off to see The Marvel's next week with our new volunteer Paul so we're looking forward to hearing their review on that one!


